Community Grants: Examples of What We Fund

The Community Grants Program of the Rotary Club of Bainbridge Island funds capital items/assets/non-consumables. We define capital expenditures as tangible items with a prolonged useful life of three years or more.

We do NOT fund operational expenses or items with a projected lifespan of less than 3 years.

Please review the list of examples below of what we fund/don't fund.

Examples of proposed capital expenditures we will consider funding:	Examples of non-capital expenditures we do not fund:
• Technology, such as computers, including first-year software subscription • Machinery and tools • Furniture, appliances, cabinetry • Building materials to construct/remodel a structure/room/area • Installing a trail, walkway or artwork • Roofing, re-wiring, flooring, and fencing • Permanent signage • Recreation and sports equipment • Equipment/gear/instruments • Medical equipment and devices • Vehicles to support programs and services • Permits, tax, shipping and labor related to purchases/projects noted above	• Tangible items with a projected lifespan of less than three years. • Ongoing software subscriptions • General program support • Single-use, disposable items, including office supplies. • Rent • Marketing • Payroll • Training and travel costs • Fundraising event costs • Land
